



GAME SET MATCH 2011

Grenache, Shiraz and Mourvedre, referred to by Australians as GSM, are the traditional red grape blend in the Rhone and in Australia. To tennis players worldwide, GSM refers to Game, Set, Match, which is the final shot which wins the match.

Variety: 74% Grenache 21% Shiraz and 5% Mourvedre

Region: McLaren Vale 100%

Tasting Note: On the aromatics, you have an instant hit of bright, fresh red fruit. The palate has a generous mixture of ripe raspberry and strawberry fruit running through, just like the aromatics; then a savory kick in the form of ground coffee and minerality. A subtle hint of chocolate is also present, but the flavorsome blend of savory and sweet fruit really stands out. The wine is medium bodied, with a nice lengthy finish.

Oak Influence: minimal; 50% of the wine was aged in oak, namely 2-5 year old, mostly French and some American, hogsheads and barrels.
